The event, co-hosted by the Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (ECLAC), the European Union and the OECD Development Centre, will enable a high-level discussion on the evolving concepts of development and international cooperation, with emphasis on the emerging concept of “development in transition”. In the framework of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and the Sustainable Development Goals, *development in transition* requires a renewed multidimensional approach to cooperation for development, beyond the traditional framework of official development assistance (ODA), and with emphasis on innovative forms of cooperation, including South-South and triangular cooperation, geared towards the adoption of effective policies to address new and persistent structural challenges.
